The Visionary



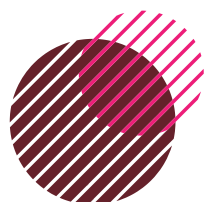

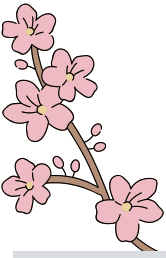
I thank you sincerely for your efforts and wish you all the best for the coming months ahead of you for better working and raising the bar of learning with the school motto “let your light shine”.

In addition to that, her rich academic expertise has enriched the lives of the students, staff and the entire institution as a whole.





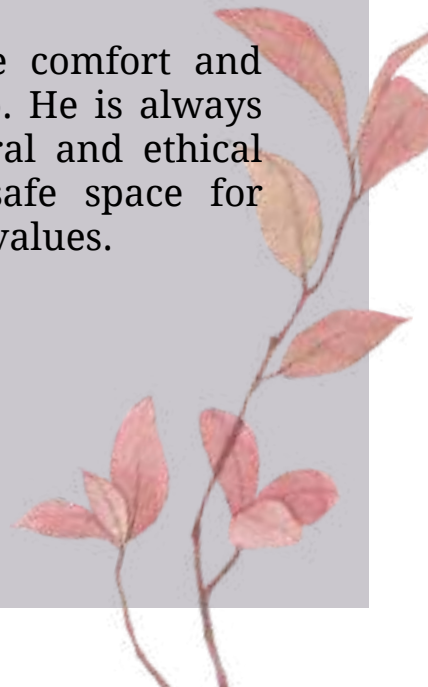
Welcome

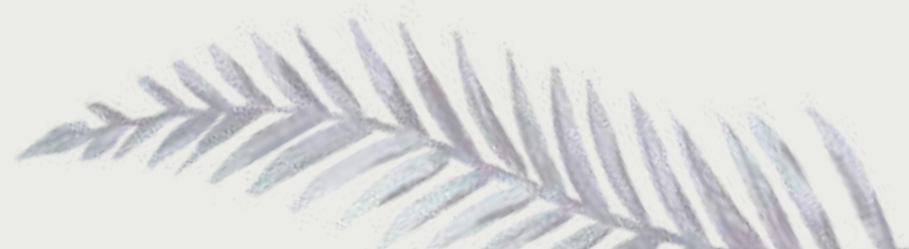
It has been an incredibly rewarding experience teaching at St Anne's for the past twenty five years. It is indeed a major milestone in my life.
