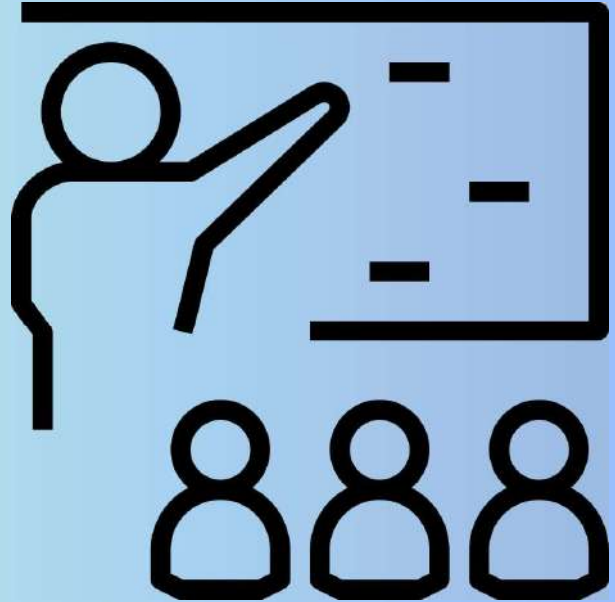

At our learning centre, inclusivity isn't just a goal; it's the foundation of everything we do.



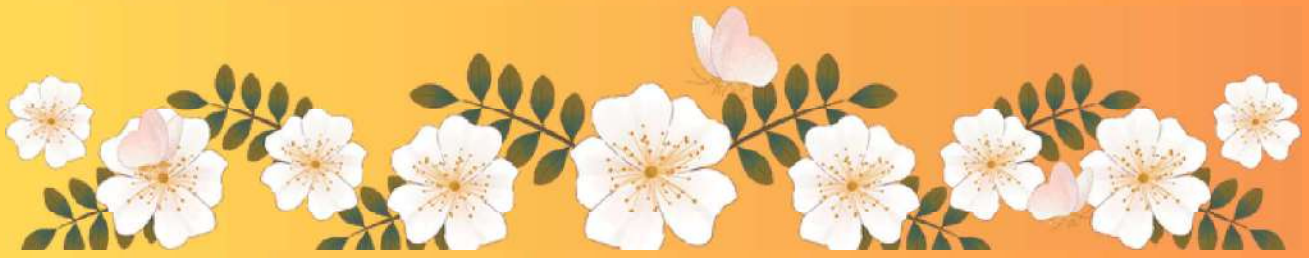


from the Doctor's Desk
